# 'WORKING TOGETHER FOR A GREEN, COMPETIVE AND INCLUSIVE EUROPE'



Despite much progress in Europe, gaps in economic development and living standards persist. The funding is targeted towards areas where there are clear needs in the beneficiary countries in line with broader European policies. Priority areas include climate change, research and innovation, civil society and investing in people through human and social development.



Promoting cooperation is a central aim of the Grants, with partnerships between organisations in the donor and beneficiary countries widely encouraged. Strengthening ties between organisations and institutions brings benefits for the beneficiary and donor countries alike.

Financial Mechanism 1994-1998

- •Beneficiary countries: Greece, Ireland, Northern Ireland, Portugal, Spain
- •Budget: €119,25M
- •Support areas: Environmental protection, education and training, transport

Financial Instrument 1999-2003

- •Beneficiary countries: Greece, Ireland, Northern Ireland, Portugal, Spain
- •Budget: €119.6M
- •Support areas: Environmental protection, urban renewal, pollution in urban areas, protection of cultural heritage, education, transport, academic research

EEA and Norway FMs

- •Beneficiary countries: Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Poland, Slovakia and Slovenia + Greece, Portugal and Spain + separate FM for Bulgaria and Romania 2007-2009
- •Budget: €1.3 bn

#### **OBJECTIVE**

Climate change mitigated and vulnerability to climate change reduced

#### AREAS OF SUPPORT

- > Strategies, action plans and/or contingency plans
- > Reduction of greenhouse gas emissions
- > Climate change adaptation measures
- > Climate change-related extreme weather preparedness and risk management
- > Carbon capture and storage

#### SUGGESTED MEASURES

- Development and implementation of national, regional and local strategies and action plans on adaptation and mitigation measures
- > Greenhouse gas emissions reduction measures in industry
- Integration of ecosystem-based solutions in action plans for adaptation and mitigation
- > Implementation of greenhouse gas capture and storage through restoration and conservation of ecosystems
- > Implementation of pilot projects for carbon capture and storage
- > Climate-proofing of infrastructure
- > Flood and drought prevention
- Mapping and assessment of specific climate change risks and integration into relevant policies, strategies and plans
- > Development of climate change-related extreme event contingency plans
- Integration of climate change-related issues into general disaster/contingency plans
- > Awareness-raising activities

Special concern shall be given to assessment of needs for policy guidance and regulatory support in the field of Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy. The possibility of implementing a small pilot project with the aim to test policy guidance documents in the cultural heritage sector shall be explored when

developing the concept note.

Measures providing added value to efforts on climate change adaptation and mitigation shall be explored when developing the concept note.

Bilateral ambitions:

€100,000 shall be allocated to the programme from the fund for bilateral relations. This does not prevent the Joint Committee for Bilateral Funds from allocating additional funds to the programme.
